Dear SilverLakes Resident:

In the aftermath of Hurricane Irma we understand that many residents have incurred damages to their homes and exterior of their properties. We also understand that there are certain items that will require immediate repair and residents may not be able to obtain the necessary city permits or approval from the association prior to making those repairs.

With that in mind we are requesting that all residents refer to the SilverLakes guidelines to ensure that any repairs or replacements stay within compliance. For your convenience, please see the guidelines via this link:

As we anticipate that many homes will have hurricane debris placed outside for extended periods of time we ask that you ensure all bulk items and debris remain on your swale area in separate piles in order to expedite pickup by your respective city. Please make every effort to avoid all bulk and debris from spilling over into the roadways. This will ensure driver and pedestrian safety. The initial debris pickup may leave behind smaller debris such as coconuts, leaves, small twigs. Each resident should attempt to dispose of this, as the second wave of debris removal may be months out.

Your association has already provided access to your respective city in order to allow debris removal and your city is making every effort to complete the debris removal in a timely manner. Please keep in mind that it is not possible at this time to provide a specific time frame for pickup in your community. Residents may visit the link for your respective city to keep up to date with all post hurricane related information, as well as the SilverLakes website and Facebook Page.

For residents with hurricane shutters still in place, we ask that you make every effort to begin removal of those shutters. Shutters should only be left up during the threat of a storm. Keeping shutters up longer than necessary poses a serious ingress/egress threat in the event of a house

fire. If you require additional time to remove the shutters, please inform Pines Property Management, and make every effort to leave yourself at least 2 points of egress.

Our landscapers will continue to work diligently to cut all SilverLakes fallen trees to ensure that we bring our communities back to pre-hurricane condition. Each resident should take the same action on their property in accordance with the association's guidelines. We also ask that residents please leave all common area debris cleanup/removal to the association's authorized vendor. Please contact Pines Property Management with any questions.

Please note that all open violations and violation inspections have been placed on hold until further notice. However we continue to ask that if you have an open violation that you do your best to address them as soon as possible. Regular community inspections are expected to begin on November 15th. Please visit the SilverLakes website at www.silverlakes.net regularly for any changes to this schedule and updates.

We realize that this storm had a severe impact on our community. We are very happy that our residents are safe and please rest assured that we will work with you during the recovery process, which we realize will take time.
